beach.

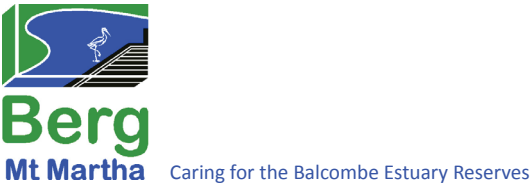

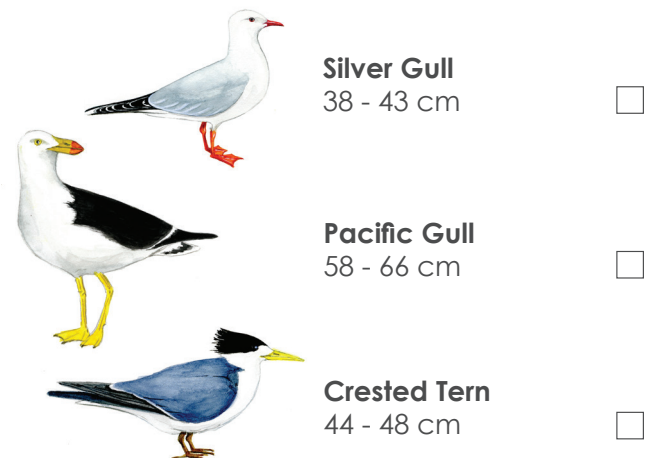
